Head Teacher Update

A huge thank you to all of our parents/carers for your assistance during the snowy days last month. Please make sure your contact details are up to date in school and if you haven't done so already - make sure you download our school app (see end of newsletter for more details).

I would like to welcome Eveline Nicolette as our Project Manager of our Place2Be service at Beckford Primary School. As I said in January's newsletter Place2Be is the UK's leading children's mental health charity providing in-school support and expert training to improve the emotional wellbeing of pupils, families, teachers and school staff. Eveline is working alongside school staff

to transform our visiting service and PT rooms into rooms that the children can access to gain support from Eveline and volunteer counsellors who will join us later on in the year. Eveline will be working in school every Monday, Tuesday and on a Wednesday morning. More information can be found on the Place2Be website https://www.place2be.org.uk.

As part of our Health and Wellbeing programme the children are continuing to learn about different areas of Health and Wellbeing under the Wellbeing Indicators: SAFE, HEALTHY, ACHIEVING, NURTURED, ACTIVE, RESPECTED, RESPONSIBLE AND INCLUDED. The indicator being focused on in February is Respected and the indicator for March is Responsible.

Through assemblies, working with the NSPCC and in class we are learning about celebrating 'Being Ourselves' during Children's Mental Health Week. Along with Place2Be we're encouraging children, young people and adults to



celebrate their uniqueness. It's all about #BeingOurselves! When we have a positive view of ourselves it can help us to cope with life's challenges, and recognising the different qualities of others can allow us to connect with those around us - which is vital for our own and others' wellbeing. Our children are very talented at Beckford and it is important for them to recognise what makes them each special and unique!
