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Celebrating Success



Already we have wonderful news to celebrate as a school. At the end of term Ms McLean and the Sports Council learned that the school had been awarded our Silver School Sports Scotland Award. We were working towards our first award of bronze, however the efforts from our whole school community and support from Clare Murphy our Active Schools Coordinator led to the school being awarded Silver - a fantastic achievement and something to build on this session with Mrs Park leading the Sports Council. Well done everyone!!

Pupil Achievements

Our first Star Pupil Award and Playground Award of the year will be presented at Friday's assembly. This is an important initiative to encourage the children to be the best that they can be in school. A pupil in each class is presented a Star Pupil Award each week chosen by the Class Teacher, a pupil from each class is chosen as the class Playground Star which is chosen by the Support Staff. The Class Values Award, chosen by the Head Teacher and Principal Teacher will now be awarded on a monthly basis.



Staff Achievements

Last session Ms Wilson led a research project focusing on the use of Media in the learning and teaching of Reading. The results were very positive and certainly enhanced the learning experiences of the pupils involved. Following submission of her final assignment, Ms Wilson has been asked to present at the Scottish Learning Festival in September. This is a great achievement and recognition of the work that Ms Wilson completed. Well done Ms Wilson!

Both Mr McCann and Mrs Graham took part in specialist training in June. They have both been awarded Level 1 Pivotal Education Trainer Status following this. Well done to them! All staff participated in Pivotal Education training during our second inset day on Wednesday. Following on from this training, as a staff we will be reviewing our behaviour system that is in place. We aim to simplify the rules and systems that are currently in place. The children and parents will be consulted over the term, with the intention that our reviewed system be in place just after the October Break. Mr McCann and Mrs Graham as Level 1 Pivotal Trainers will lead the review process.

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
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GO FOR GREEN

We will be continuing with our promoting positive behaviour initiative 'Go For Green' until our current system has been reviewed.

Go For Green means that every pupil in school will be placed on their 'class tree' and if they are able to follow the school rules they stay on green for the day. This is then recorded into your child's diary. Any pupil with 2 ambers or 1 red over the week will have reflection time on a Friday and a note put in their diary from the Head Teacher. I would appreciate it if you could discuss this system with your child and sign to acknowledge you have seen the Head Teacher note if your child is ever on reflection. I am pleased to say we are off to a positive start and every child remained on green last week! Well done everyone!!



School Uniform

Our children have returned to school looking very smart and eager to learn, which is wonderful to see. For reference, our school uniform is:

- White shirt and tie (except gym days)
- Grey or black skirt or trousers
- Burgundy or grey jumper, cardigan or sweatshirt
- White or yellow polo shirt

It would be lovely to see as many of our P7 children wearing a shirt and tie, as this sets a good example for our younger children and any visitors to the school too. Please make sure every item is labelled.

If you have been in the school already you may have noticed that we have had new carpets put in the corridors of our school. These carpets have to last us a long time and we want to take care of them, therefore **can I also ask that you ensure your child has suitable indoor shoes to be kept in school. These will also be required for PE, therefore I would ask that indoor shoes are not slippers. Thank you!!**



Other Useful Items

Your child is also welcome to bring in a small bottle of plain water each day, which they will bring home, each day, to be refilled at home. Flavoured water or juice is not permitted in the classroom, however should your child wish to drink flavoured water or juice, they can do so at lunchtime in the lunch hall.

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Physical Education

Milk is available to be purchased by all children for 20p at playtimes in Beckford Primary.

Can I please remind parents/carers that lunch is free to all children in Primary 1 to 3 and that there is a charge of £1.65 for children from Primary 4 to 7, unless parents have successfully applied for free meals for their children. Can I ask that you ensure your child has their money each day. Unfortunately we still have money outstanding from last session, which should still be paid by those families who have been previously notified.

Meet the Teacher

Permission letters for Twitter and the app will be sent out this week and Primary 1 will be issued with Place2Be permission letters also.


Can I please ask that if you have not done so already that you return all of these forms asap. Many thanks in advance for your support in this matter.

CHILDREN'S ABSENCES

Please note that should your child be ill and unable to attend school that it is important that the school be notified by 9.30 am.

It is also important that the school has up to date contact details including:

- Emergency contact details



If a child's absence has not been reported to the school, a member of staff will contact the child's parent/carer to find out why the child is absent. The safety and wellbeing of our children is everyone's first priority. Further information can be found in South Lanarkshire Council's 'Are you sure your child is at school today?' policy.

If your child has been ill due to sickness or diarrhoea please note that the advice from the NHS is that a child should not return to school until 48 hours after his/her last episode of sickness or diarrhoea. This is to reduce any further spread of infection.

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


Twitter - Updates on activities and the learning and teaching experiences of our children are also placed through the school's Twitter Account.
