#### Head Teacher Update

It was lovely to welcome back all of our children on Monday after our October Break. The weather has certainly changed greatly during the month of October and is beginning to become quite cold. As you are aware our school is very busy at drop off and collection times. We work hard at Beckford to teach the children about road safety as part of our health and wellbeing learning from Primary 1 to Primary 7.

I have noticed that instead of using the zebra crossing to cross over to the car park at

Morrisons from the school, many parents and carers are crossing at our car park opening with their children. This has led to some of our children, who are crossing without an adult, copying what the adults are doing. As there are cars leaving from the

underground car park at Morrisons, this presents as a real risk to our children. I would greatly appreciate it if we could all cross at the zebra crossing.

I would also like to <u>note that at no time</u> should our children be dropped off at the car park opening. We have been notified by support services that any cars stopping there to drop off children could be prosecuted by the police should they be caught doing this, therefore again, please ensure that your child is dropped off at a safe place and not at the side of the road on Auchinraith Avenue.

# PROMOTING POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR AND RELATIONSHIPS

There is a lot of excitement within the school as we work towards beginning our new approach to promoting positive behaviour and relationships at Beckford. Our new system will be in place from Monday 29<sup>th</sup> of October and replaces our Go For Green approach. Our children are all aware of our new school rules; READY, RESPECTFUL, SAFE, which are displayed throughout the school.



We are working towards demonstrating above and beyond behaviours in class through our school values. Children will be recognised for demonstrating these behaviours on their recognition walls in class. The aim is to 'reach for the stars', ie to go as far as they can go each week on the wall. Each class have designed their own theme for their recognition walls as you can see below.









On a Friday a child in each class will be nominated to attend HOT CHOCOLATE FRIDAY with Mrs Hogg or Mr McCann. Staff will nominate someone who has shown truly over and above behaviour during that week. It may be for showing over and above behaviour with regards; resilience, contribution within school and the community or for achievement. We can't wait to get started with Hot Chocolate



Friday and our new mugs have arrived just in time!

Our reflection time is changing also and instead of being on reflection on a Friday for being on red or 2 ambers, your child may be asked to take some reflection at the time they are not following our new school rules. At this time a member of staff will hold a restorative conversation with your child to support them to redirect their behaviour in a positive way. The aim is to support the children to refocus and continue with their learning. Should your child be unable to do so, he/she may be placed on amber or red and will be referred to SMT.


Our ultimate goal is to ensure that with Better Relationships, will allow for Better Learning and Better Behaviour.
