READY, RESPECTFUL, SAFE



We continue to promote positive relationships and behaviour through our Ready, Respectful and Safe policy.

We aim to encourage the children to go 'above and beyond' in school and to support the children to make the right choices to maximise opportunities for learning time in the classroom.

Our three rules are; READY, RESPECTFUL, SAFE

which are underpinned by our four school values – FRIENDLY, CARING, KINDNESS, RESPONSIBLE AND RESPECTFUL. Both our rules and values will be discussed in class and at weekly assemblies.

<u>Water</u>

As you are aware the children are encouraged to bring a small bottle of water to school each day. As per South Lanarkshire Policy, the children should only have water in their bottle and not flavoured water or diluting juice, unless there is a medical need for there to be so. If there is a medical need please speak to Mrs Hogg or Miss Reilly.

The children may bring diluting juice or fruit juice to have in the lunch hall. We would appreciate your support with this matter.

CHILDREN'S ABSENCES

Please note that should your child be ill and unable to attend school that it is important that the school be notified by 9.30 am.

It is also important that the school has up to date contact details including:

- Home telephone number
- Mobile number
- Emergency contact details



If a child's absence has not been reported to the school, a member of staff will contact the child's parent/carer to find out why the child is absent. The safety and wellbeing of our children is everyone's first priority. Further information can be found in South Lanarkshire Council's 'Are you sure your child is at school today?' policy.

If your child has been ill due to sickness, diarrhoea or a temperature please note that the advice from the NHS is that a child should not return to school until 48 hours after his/her last episode of sickness, diarrhoea or temperature. This is to reduce any further spread of infection.
