SNAPSHOT ASSESSMENT BLOCK

The children have been working on various areas of assessment, last week and this week. This is part of our annual Quality Improvement Calendar, where we look periodically to identify areas of strength that your child is able to show and next steps for learning.

If your child is in Primary 2 upwards, you will see some changes to the content of the snapshot over the year. This is to allow us to gather a broad range of evidence from different areas of the curriculum.

This term we are assessing reading skills, writing (e.g. a piece of imaginative writing could be a story that your child has produced) and your child will also sit a Numeracy and Mathematics assessment which gives them the opportunity to show their understanding across all areas of learning to date since starting back in August.

As always parents/carers are given the opportunity to provide feedback or ask questions from the snapshot, which you will get the opportunity to see in the next couple of weeks. An addition to this is that we are going to include an area for the children to provide feedback, so please take time to do this with your child when the book is sent home. Thank you!
